Historical Information

Context for Record Type: Business records, both volumes and loose records, are in some cases transferred to the Library of Virginia as components of court record transfers. These business records in some cases were simply stored in the local court building for safekeeping by business owners. In other cases, business records (particularly ledgers, account books, etc.) may have been filed in a court case as an exhibit. These business record exhibits appeared both in chancery causes and in judgments, these records serving as exhibits for business dissolution cases, debt suits, and contract disputes.

Locality History: Pittsylvania County was named in honor of William Pitt, first Earl of Chatham, a great English statesman. It was formed from Halifax County in 1766.

Scope and Content
