Abstract

The papers consist largely of manuscripts (drafts, galleys, proofs), notes, and other research material relating to Couper's interest in the history of Lexington and Rockbridge County (Virginia), the Virginia Military Institute, and the Shenandoah Valley. Other topics include the construction of Fort Jackson, South Carolina in 1917, and General Stonewall Jackson.

The papers are filed in 36 manuscript boxes (13 cubic feet) and also contain oversized material located in map cases.

Biographical/Historical Information

William Couper spent the majority of his professional life devoted to the Virginia Military Institute and to the study of VMI, Lexington and Rockbridge County, and Virginia history. His terms as VMI's Business Executive and Historiographer encompassed thirty years, but before, during and subsequent to that period he served in many other official and unofficial capacities. He was a noted authority on local and regional history, and on the life and times of General Stonewall Jackson. At VMI, in addition to his official duties, he was responsible for the initial organization and preservation of the Institute's rich historical holdings, including its unique collection of alumni biographical and genealogical materials.

William Couper Chronology. Significant Events. 1884 Born November 16 at "Oakland" in Norfolk, Virginia. 1901 Graduated from the Norfolk Academy and entered the Third Class at the Virginia Military Institute. 1904 Graduated from VMI with distinction (Engineering course). 1906 Received a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering (railroad option) from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. 1906 - 1917 Worked with the Pennsylvania Railroad at New York City on construction, operating and harbor work; he played a major role in the construction of the railroad tunnels and terminals for NYC. 1912 Published "History of the Engineering, Construction and Equipment of the Pennsylvania Railroad New York Tunnels and Terminals. " 1917 June Commissioned Major in the United States Army Quartermaster Corps and assigned as Construction Officer at Camp Jackson, Columbia, South Carolina. 1918 March Promoted to Lt. Col., in charge

of the building of the camp that became Fort Jackson. 1920 Completed Army service in March; prepared on request a plan of development for the future of VMI, which was adopted by the VMI Board of Visitors in June. 1920 - 1921 Assistant General Manager of the Associated General Contractors of America 1921 - 1924 Employed jointly by the Texas Company and the Southern Acid and Sulphur Company as an engineer to develop sulphur properties in Brazoria Co., Texas. 1924 Appointed Business Executive in charge of the business activities at the Veterans's Bureau Station at Perry Point, Maryland, where a supply depot, hospital for neuropsychiatric patients, rehabilitation schools and automobile reconditioning shops were operated. 1925 Appointed Business Executive at the Virginia Military Institute. 1931 - 1933 Secretary and Treasurer of the VMI Alumni Association. 1933 Published *The VMI New Market Cadets* 1934 Appointed VMI Historiographer. 1934 - 1935 President of the Association of Military Colleges and Universities in the U. S. 1934 - 1945 Secretary and Treasurer of the Southern Conference (Athletics) 1936 Published *Claudius Crozet* 1939 Published *One Hundred Years at VMI and The Register of Former Cadets* 1946 -1948 Vice President and President of the Southern Conference. 1952 Published *A History of the Shenandoah Valley* 1954 Retired from his positions at VMI. 1964 Died February 15 at his home in Lexington, Virginia. Buried Norfolk, Virginia.

Scope and Content Information

The William Couper Papers document a portion of the life and career of a man notable for his research and publications about the history of the Virginia Military Institute; the Lexington, Rockbridge County and Shenandoah Valley (Virginia) areas; Virginia history and genealogy; Civil War General Stonewall Jackson; and Claudius Crozet.

A significant portion of the papers consist of publication manuscripts (drafts, galleys, proofs), notes, and other material related to Couper's major historical research projects (many of which were published). These include *One Hundred Years at VMI*, a four volume comprehensive history of the Institute from it's founding in 1839 through 1939; *The VMI New Market Cadets*, containing biographical information about the VMI students and staff who fought in the Civil War battle on May 15, 1864; *Claudius Crozet*, a biography of the notable 19th century Virginia Civil Engineer; *History of the Shenandoah Valley*; and "Stonewall Jackson Day by Day," a chronological account including events, anecdotes, clippings, transcribed correspondence, notes, and maps.

Couper's passion for the history of Lexington and Rockbridge County (VA) is evident in the substantial amount of local history research material found in his papers. Included are notes on a wide range of local history topics, as well as extensive research material (notes and maps) concerning the history of many local properties and the Lexington cemetery.

The papers also include material concerning the construction of Fort Jackson, South Carolina; Couper's speeches and addresses; maps; scrapbooks; photograph albums; and miscellaneous correspondence.
