Moore (1858-1936), of Ravenswood, West Virginia, who was president of the West Virginia Hardware Association; the collection contains newspaper clippings and other material regarding him and the Moore-Summers Hardware Company. Moore married Glenn F. Allen in 1921; her married name is given as Amy M. Allen. The collection contains a wedding announcement and congratulatory telegram, as well as other material regarding the couple.
